




#### SO WE WENT AND ASKED

- MSHDA Housing Readiness Fund grant to tell 15-30 "stories"
- Toolkit Survey told us who was engaged with us, and with reform
- Growth analysis by number and percent identified places that are building housing one way or another
- Representation by region, community type, and growth context
- And then it was just who would take my calls!





#### CHART: TOOL USAGE BY COMMUNITIES SURVEYED



# **ZONING REFORM STUDIES: TOOLKIT SURVEY**

- 111 unique and identified communities, evenly split between cities/villages and townships
- 78% were growing
  - 11 of top 23 communities by number
  - 1 of top 33 communities by percent
- Making the uses more flexible and moving to administrative review were at the top of the list
- Communities that knew about the Toolkit implemented more reforms than those that didn't
