



a site similar to Columbus' LinkUS comprehensive transportation model for Central Ohio









- 2 fiscal years 2025 and 2026 call for projects
- Estimated \$11.6 million available (at least 55% capital and up to 45% operating)





RTA CALL FOR PROJECTS: SCHEDULE




Image- TriMet Blog. Transit Signal Priority 101

Examples: Mobility as a Service Pilot, paratransit booking improvements, and Transit Signal Priority.




